Literacy and Numeracy

- We are focussing on Oral Language, writing genres and reading fluency. This month the topic is The Environment.. We have completed work on the genre of report writing and now this month we will work on narrative . As part of the WSE recommendations we are concentrating on handwriting and the presentation of work in copies. The infants have started to learn cursive writing as this is a recommended approach and has proven benefits.
- Numeracy: We are concentrating on learning our tables and we continue the work on problem solving. Please support your child with problem solving.
- SPHE: We have chosen this subject as our next focus. We are currently looking at how we teach the subject , we are looking at the resources we use in detail and how we can deliver the SPHE programme in a consistent and coherent manner throughout the school.

Junior infants:

It is great to see how quickly the junior infants have settled in. Remember to continue to support your child with their homework. They will tell you they know how to do it and want independence but at this stage they still need you. A one to one at home is so valuable.
