School will closed on Thursday the 14th and Friday the 15th of February for half term.

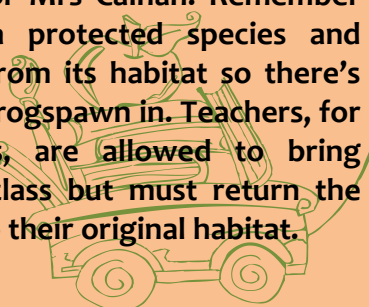
Read on and see what has been happening this month.
